COMPETITION CONDITIONS

ACTIVE CONGU Handicap Certificates for the current year must be produced at all County Competitions. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

Payment of the mandatory County Per Capita Levy entitles playing members of affiliated clubs to compete in all County Competitions whether as individuals or representing their club. Any club or member whose Affiliation Fee and Per Capita Levy has not been paid may not enter any county competition.

All cheques should be made payable to SCLGA. Separate cheques for each event.

Entries: Please send one entry form plus one cheque per competition to the appropriate organiser with either an email address or an S.A.E. for the start sheet. All start sheets will also be posted on the SCLGA website.

Competitors may compete in the Championship on qualifying day only. First round losers will be expected to play in the Championship Plate.

Competitors who reduce their handicap below the minimum for qualification after closing date must play off new handicap but are not eligible for scratch prize.

Competitors who increase their handicap above the maximum for qualification after closing date must play off the handicap limit for any handicap prize.

Lunch and/or tea will be ordered for all competitors. All caddies' meals must be ordered directly with the club.

Fees of competitors who enter; but withdraw after closing dates of the respective meetings, are not refundable.

Ties to be decided on the last 18, 9, 6, 3 or 1 hole, commensurate with the nature of the competition.

Any queries arising during the meeting shall be decided by the Committee of the Day.

No competitor may take more than one prize in any competition, EXCEPT for aggregates and the Veterans over 70s.

Bucket holes not allowed.

The Committee reserves the right to alter conditions of play on the day.

Competitors are reminded of the R & A Rule 6 – 3(a) re late arrival.

N.B. Buggies may be used by those players whose normal way of playing is with the use of a buggy for medical reasons. A letter from their Club Secretary will be required as well as permission from the host club. Opponents or playing partners may be invited to use the buggy facilities.

Mobile phones must be switched off and only used in extreme emergencies.

Distance Measuring Devices may be used. However, the use of devices measuring wind speed, temperature, gradient etc. may not be used and to do so would be in breach of Rule 14.3. Penalty – disqualification of the player involved.
